Ending an Era, We Sold Granby House, Our Original Home 35 Years Ago







Housing Our Community

After spending over 3 years unhoused in Virginia Beach, I was referred to LGBT Life Center's rapid rehousing program. I was facing numerous barriers to housing and didn't know if I would ever be able to live independently. I was able to connect with a housing specialist at LGBT Life Center, and I was finally approved for a unit and obtained a Section 8 voucher. Through perseverance and the support of LGBT Life Center staff, I was able to achieve my goal of finding a permanent home.





Health Care is Holistic

I started as a client through LGBT Life Center's Healthy Living Project. I was depressed and thinking about suicide, and wasn't in a place where I wanted The Center's help. Their Health Navigator, Ricky Stith, tried to reach out to me several times, but I wouldn't answer or would hangup. I wasn't ready. Eventually, I did reach back out to Mr. Ricky, and he helped me get in a better headspace. Through counseling, I've managed to feel stable and get a full time job for the past 6 months.
